## **1. Victory but strife** (Judges 7:15-8:28)



## 1. Sin leads to cruel oppression (Judges 7:15-8:3)


<sup>15</sup> When Gideon heard the account of the dream and its interpretation, he bowed in worship. He returned to the camp of Israel and said, "Arise, for the Lord has given the camp of Midian into your hands."

<sup>16</sup> He divided the 300 men into three companies, and he put trumpets and empty pitchers into the hands of all of them, with torches inside the pitchers. <sup>17</sup> He said to them, "Look at me and do likewise. And behold, when I come to the outskirts of the camp, do as I do.

<sup>18</sup> When I and all who are with me blow the trumpet, then you also blow the trumpets all around the camp and say, 'For the Lord and for Gideon.'" <sup>19</sup> So Gideon and the hundred men who were with him came to the outskirts of the camp at the beginning of the middle watch, when they had just posted the watch; and they blew the trumpets and smashed the pitchers that were in their hands. <sup>20</sup> When the three companies blew the trumpets and broke the pitchers, they held the torches in their left hands and the trumpets in their right hands for blowing, and cried, "A sword for the Lord and for Gideon!"

<sup>21</sup> Each stood in his place around the camp; and all the army ran, crying out as they fled. <sup>22</sup> When they blew 300 trumpets, the Lord set the sword of one against another even throughout the whole army; and the army fled as far as Beth-shittah toward Zererah, as far as the edge of Abel-meholah, by Tabbath.


<sup>23</sup> The men of Israel were summoned from Naphtali and Asher and all Manasseh, and they pursued Midian.



<sup>24</sup> Gideon sent messengers throughout all the hill country of Ephraim, saying, "Come down against Midian and take the waters before them, as far as Beth-barah and the Jordan." So all the men of Ephraim were summoned and they took the waters as far as Beth-barah and the Jordan. <sup>25</sup> They captured the two leaders of Midian, Oreb and Zeeb, and they killed Oreb at the rock of Oreb, and they killed Zeeb at the wine press of Zeeb, while they pursued Midian; and they brought the heads of Oreb and Zeeb to Gideon from across the Jordan. <sup>1</sup> Then the men of Ephraim said to him, "What is this thing you have done to us, not calling us when you went to fight against Midian?" And they contended with him vigorously.

<sup>2</sup> But he said to them, "What have I done now in comparison with you? Is not the gleaning of the grapes of Ephraim better than the vintage of Abiezer? <sup>3</sup> God has given the leaders of Midian, Oreb and Zeeb into your hands; and what was I able to do in comparison with you?" Then their anger toward him subsided when he said that.

## **2. Lack of cooperation but victory** (8:4-21)



2. Lack of cooperation but victory (8:4-21)

- <sup>4</sup> Then Gideon and the 300 men who were with him came to the Jordan and crossed over, weary yet pursuing.
- <sup>5</sup> He said to the men of Succoth, "Please give loaves of bread to the people who are following me, for they are weary, and I am pursuing Zebah and Zalmunna, the kings of Midian."

<sup>6</sup> The leaders of Succoth said, "Are the hands of Zebah and Zalmunna already in your hands, that we should give bread to your army?"



<sup>7</sup> Gideon said, "All right, when the Lord has given Zebah and Zalmunna into my hand, then I will thrash your bodies with the thorns of the wilderness and with briers."

<sup>8</sup> He went up from there to Penuel and spoke similarly to them; and the men of Penuel answered him just as the men of Succoth had answered.

<sup>9</sup> So he spoke also to the men of Penuel, saying, "When I return safely, I will tear down this tower." <sup>10</sup> Now Zebah and Zalmunna were in Karkor, and their armies with them, about 15,000 men, all who were left of the entire army of the sons of the east; for the fallen were 120,000 swordsmen.

<sup>11</sup> Gideon went up by the way of those who lived in tents on the east of Nobah and Jogbehah, and attacked the camp when the camp was unsuspecting. <sup>12</sup> When Zebah and Zalmunna fled, he pursued them and captured the two kings of Midian, Zebah and Zalmunna, and routed the whole army.

<sup>13</sup> Then Gideon the son of Joash returned from the battle by the ascent of Heres. <sup>14</sup> And he captured a youth from Succoth and questioned him. Then the youth wrote down for him the princes of Succoth and its elders, seventy-seven men.

<sup>15</sup> He came to the men of Succoth and said, "Behold Zebah and Zalmunna, concerning whom you taunted me, saying, 'Are the hands of Zebah and Zalmunna already in your hand, that we should give bread to your men who are weary?'" <sup>16</sup> He took the elders of the city, and thorns of the wilderness and briers, and he disciplined the men of Succoth with them.

<sup>17</sup> He tore down the tower of Penuel and killed the men of the city.

<sup>18</sup> Then he said to Zebah and Zalmunna, "What kind of men were they whom you killed at Tabor?" And they said, "They were like you, each one resembling the son of a king." <sup>19</sup> He said, "They were my brothers, the sons of my mother. As the Lord lives, if only you had let them live, I would not kill you." <sup>20</sup> So he said to Jether his firstborn, "Rise, kill them." But the youth did not draw his sword, for he was afraid, because he was still a youth.

<sup>21</sup> Then Zebah and Zalmunna said, "Rise up yourself, and fall on us; for as the man, so is his strength." So Gideon arose and killed Zebah and Zalmunna, and took the crescent ornaments which were on their camels' necks.
